The Bonneville County Sheriff's Office will conduct testing for applicants who are interested in future positions in the following areas: Patrol Officer, Jail Detention, Court Detention Officer or Volunteer Reserves.

The Law Enforcement (Patrol) testing is for Patrol Peace Officer and Volunteer Reserve positions. The Correction (Jail) testing is for Jail Detention Officer and Court Detention Officer positions.

Written test for Law Enforcement and Corrections positions measures the applicant's English language ability in the areas of: reading, reading comprehension, memory retention and basic math skills. THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE DOESN'T PROVIDE STUDY MATERIALS FOR THE WRITTEN TEST. Once the timed portion of the test has started, anyone who is late will not be

allowed to take the test during that testing session. Seating is limited to 25 applicants per test session. Sessions are filled based on receipt of application.

The patrol physical abilities test includes: an approximate 440 yard obstacle course run, pushing, pulling, and lifting 80 pounds of weight and vaulting over a 3 foot high horizontal bar. The jail physical abilities test includes: an approximate 209 yard obstacle course run, pushing, pulling and lifting 60 lbs of weight and vaulting over a three foot high bar. Applicants must take separate written tests for law enforcement and jail if they wish to be considered for both positions. Applicants who score 60% or better on the written test are eligible to take the physical abilities test on March 13, 2010 or March 20, 2010 (both on Saturday). Sign-ups for the physical abilities test will take place immediately following the completion and passing of the written test.

This testing will form an applicant eligibility list for the coming year or until another test is given. You must participate in entry level testing if you wish to be considered for a Patrol, Jail, Court Detention or Reserve position with the Bonneville County Sheriff's Office.

**INTERESTED APPLICANTS MUST HAVE A CURRENT APPLICATION ON FILE WITH THE PERSONNEL OFFICE AND SCHEDULE TESTING APPOINTMENTS NO LATER THAN 5:00 P.M., FRIDAY, February 26, 2010. You must be a US citizen, speak English and meet all Idaho Peace Officer Standards and Training Council requirements.** To schedule testing, please call the Personnel Office at (208) 529-1340.
